



Michigan Duck Hunter's Association Receives Partners in Conservation Award ...working to conserver the Michigan Waterfowl Legacy!

Recognizing the organization's dedication to wetlands and waterfowl issues, the Department of Natural Resources honored the Michigan Duck Hunters Association (MDHA) with a DNR Partners in Conservation Award at the January 2013 meeting of the Natural Resources Commission in Lansing. In presenting the award to MDHA President Marc Curtis, DNR Director Keith Creagh gave special Administration of the state's Waterfowl Stamp Program since 1998;

- Hosting of numerous youth hunting events;




The Frank's Great Outdoors Parent-Youth Canoe Race





Featured Photographer: Kim LeBlanc



Kim's love for the outdoors and nature is what started him on the road to photography. He had always spent a lot of time outdoors, hunting and fishing. What better way to share some of the sights of nature and the great outdoors than with a camera in hand. His first photos were of distant deer, eagles, ect. That is when he learned that a good blind set up was very important. Besides having descent equipment you need to blend in very well in order to get most wildlife in close enough to photograph.

He started photographing at the Shiawassee National wildlife refuge after turning in eagle sightings with colored bands. At first they weren't sure what they stood for, but they put him in contact with the group down in Lansing that did eagle monitoring through out the state. He was the only one around that was turning in ID numbers from live birds! This was very successful data in tracking eagle's movements after they leave the nest. He would get close enough to pull the code letters and numbers off. After that he started accompanying the researcher's to the

nests photographing and eventually helping to hold birds during banding process. This has been shown on the Mike Avery show. He has also taken photos of wildlife from other states as he and his family has explored the United States, including Minnesota and Wisconsin.

The refuge system had used many of his photos for brochures, slide programs and law enforcement issues. Kim also does vol-

unteer work for the refuge system, doing bird counts and reporting rare or unusual sightings captured on film. He has also played a significant role over the years in photographing the Endangered Peregrine Falcon and reporting data from their bands to the USFW. This is an important way other amateur photographers can assist with ongoing migratory bird research projects.

When asked what advice he would share with other aspiring wildlife photographers hopeful of taking great photos he said, "First you have to spend a lot of time in the woods, many more hours than you would think. Next you have to know the habits of the wildlife you plan to photograph, and how to set up small blinds they will allow for close contact. You very seldom can get guality photos by just chance encounters hiking around in the woods, and then you must have great patience because there will be many hours of nothing to photograph." Kim takes advantage of his time by reading his favorite outdoor magazine in the blind!

DUCKS UNLIMITED **RESTORES COASTAL** WETLANDS ALONG THE SAGINAW BAY

The coastal wetlands that rim Saginaw Bay provide crucial habitat to waterfowl during both spring and fall migrations. Their presence has also fostered a strong waterfowl hunting tradition throughout the Bay region as hunters flock to the area in pursuit of waterfowling opportunities. With funding from the Grant Lakes Restoration Initiative provided by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, a partnership formed between Ducks Unlimited, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and Fish Point Wildlife Association has been able to restore wetlands that will serve both waterfowl and waterfowl hunters at Fish Point State Wildlife Area well.

Due to their fertile underlying soils, many of the wetlands within the Saginaw Bay watershed have been drained and converted to agricultural land since pre-settlement times. This activity has greatly diminished the amount of habitat available to wildlife and increased the amount of chemical and sediment run-off entering the Great Lakes. In 2010, Ducks Unlimited applied for and received grant funds on behalf of the partnership to restore a 19-acre tract of previously converted agriculture land along Saginaw Bay back to coastal wetland habitat. This project addresses water quality by disabling drain tiles, reconfiguring a tile pump, and filtering agricultural run-off through the restored wetland, benefiting the overall health of Saginaw Bay for a multitude of wildlife and fish species. The construction of low level berms and installation of a water level control structure and pump was completed in December 2012. The spring of 2013 marks the first time that the site has not been drained in more than 75 years. The resiliency of the wetland seed bank will become evident this summer as vegetation begins to flourish, morphing back into a wetland where ducks and hunters can both enjoy the newly restored habitat this fall.

Work in the Saginaw Bay and around the continent is made possible by conservation partnerships and by the volunteers of Ducks Unlimited.

Featured Taxidermist: Kevin Perry

When Kevin Perry was growing up he got in a lot of trouble. He wasn't going down the best road in life but that would soon change. His second cousin took Kevin hunting when he was 16 and Kevin shot the first thing he saw, a 6 point buck. After that hunting trip Kevin fell in love with the outdoors. He loved it so much he wanted to learn everything about it and taxidermy was just a portion of it. Now Kevin has been a taxidermist for 33 years and has been a commercial taxidermist for 28 years. His favorite things to mount are fish and mammals. And he was even a state champion with one of his fish mounts. Now he doesn't do much competing of his own but he loves it so much he became a judge for the state show.

Kevin is also a member of the Past Present Michigan Taxidermy Association. When Kevin was on the Board of Directors he was always trying to start new programs so more children could enjoy the outdoors just like he did when he was a child. But his ideas always got shot down. Then when Kevin became president of the association it was his time to shine. Kevin's dream came true as he worked through MTA to initiate the "Dream Makers Project." This program provides a unique opportunity for mentally disadvantage children to experience hunting in Michigan's great outdoors! The MTA partners each child with a hunting mentor who helps them prepare for the hunt and then accompanies them out on their first hunting experience. Kevin also took the lead in establishing a youth division within the MTA, where adult members mentor the youth in hunting, trapping and fishing and organizes opportunities for the kids to go on hunting adventures.

Today, Kevin shares his enthusiasm and love for the outdoors with visitors at the Johnson Hunting and Fishing Visitors Center, at the Mitchell's State Park in Cadillac. There he works as a part-time naturalist guide introducing thousands of youth annually to the joys that are found in Michigan's Great Outdoors through Hunting, Fishing and Trapping!

The Saginaw Bay Watershed Initiative Network (WIN), a community-based initiative that connects people with organizations, programs, and resources, has recently funded a project to help promote and implement the Michigan Waterfowl Legacy in the Saginaw Bay region, which is the largest watershed in Michigan. The Michigan Waterfowl Legacy (MWL) is a 10-year, cooperative partnership to restore, conserve, and celebrate Michigan's waterfowl, wetlands, and waterfowl hunting community. The legacy is an important "Call to Action" that hopes to honor yesterday by celebrating past accomplishments in conservation, to engage today by embracing our current conservation projects and efforts, and to build tomorrow by enriching our waterfowl hunting heritage and increasing our support of wetland conservation. The Michigan Waterfowl Legacy is about community, which involves waterfowlers, other hunters, and the general public. In order to involve the community, funding for the implementation of MWL to the Saginaw Bay region will be used for development and promotion of tourism opportunities, public events, outreach materials, educational toolkits, and lesson plans related to waterfowl and the wetlands. By developing and promoting these materials, this project seeks to increase the enjoyment and use of the wetlands by Saginaw Bay citizens, to promote the conservation value of waterfowl hunting, and to communicate the economic importance of waterfowl and the wetlands to the Saginaw Bay region. We hope to create a

call to action for citizens in Saginaw Bay to become engaged and supportive of waterfowl and wetland conservation efforts. In order to protect our natural resources now, it is necessary to develop an engaged partnership, which includes the citizens in the community. Let's get excited about and celebrate our waterfowl heritage! Here are 10 ways that you can help to conserve waterfowl and the wetlands:






